




Strategic Priority 1: Land-use & Policy Priorities


Towards Continuous Improvement:

Financial Review

- \$300,000 approved by Alberta Livestock & Meat Agency (ALMA) to Alberta Milk (holds AEPA account).
- \$100,000 per year for 3 years (2009/2010 to 2011/2012).
- Secretariat manpower & expenses contributed by Alberta Agriculture & Rural Development.
- Member organizations provide in-kind contributions.


